DAY 1-Tuesday November 14th









Objectives for Informational Sharing Module

A. To raise the awareness and knowledge sharing about the value of maintaining the current status <u>of coral reefs and coastal environments</u> and how it pertains to keeping the local tourism business healthy. And to share scientific knowledge and sustainable management of our oceans one project location at a time.

- **B**. To provide strategic information as input for the implementation of The Research Enhancement Engineering for Seascapes (R.E.E.F.S.) Program which includes maintenance and care of ground water and sediment runoff
- **C**. To develop short term action plans that can be acted upon **now** not in life times. Identifying land based and marine based threats to reefs and coastal regions and monitoring plans using the **Coral Reef Mapping Tool** and the mobile application for citizen input. And to create local high and low tech jobs for local participants.
- **D**. To identify what and how technology plays major roll in conservation programs.
- **E**. To identify the crucial role of <u>gender equality</u> as a driver of development progress, recognizing that the potential of women IN PARTNERSHIP WITH



has not been fully realized, owing to persistent social, economic and political inequalities. Gender inequalities are still deeprooted in every society. Women suffer from lack of access to decent work and face occupational segregation and gender wage gaps. In many situations, they are denied access to basic education and health care and are victims of violence and discrimination. They are under-represented and under-utilized in political and economic decision-making processes.

- **F. WFCRC** seeks a stronger commitment to partnership and cooperation and is needed to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals. That effort will require coherent policies, an enabling environment for sustainable development at all levels and by all actors and a reinvigorated Global Partnership for Sustainable Development.
- **G**. Introduce SXM to **The St. Maarten Caribbean Sea Turtle**, a life sized bronze monument to be used as an underwater diving attraction to raise awareness for threats of sea turtles in the ocean.
